Fellow South Africans, this year's Local Government election marked South Africa's third successful local government elections by the Independent Electoral Commission of South Africa. As alluded above, the former Mayor Comrade Milton Morema whom I will always be indebted to has laid a solid basis and foundation to ensure that we move forward and create a municipality of prosperity and opportunities for all. In this context, I therefore take this opportunity to thank Comrade Milton Morema for sterling job and significant advances he made in building Bushbuckridge Local Municipality to be where it is today. Developments are there for everyone to see.

All Councillors signed contracts with the people, when they were sworn in on the 01st of June 2011; that by itself was a prove that all Councillors understood the role expected of them to play. The local sphere of government has a direct contact with the electorates. To that end, it is fundamental to know that as Councillors this is not an employment opportunity, but a task that which seek to undo the injustices done by apartheid.

In his state of the Nation Address 2009, President Jacob Zuma alluded that the fight against poverty remains the corner stone of our government's focus.

I quote:"

- For as long as there are South Africans who die from preventable disease.
- For as long there are workers who struggle to feed their families and who battle to find work.
- For as long as there are communities without clean water, decent shelter or proper sanitation.

This is category B municipality and it was declared in 2001 by the former State President, Thabo Mbeki as a nodal point. It is therefore important to know and acknowledge the fact that we are the only people who can turn things around. This Council wants to see improvement on revenue collection and those responsible for ensuring that there is revenue collection must consolidate their strategies, because ours as the political leadership is to see this municipality growing in leaps and bounds by boosting better revenue collection.

Fellow South Africans, allow me to detail to you our programme for the next five years this Council wants to embark on programmes that will ensure the electorate – our people that the ANC led government will never put the Revolution on Auction by failing to come with programmes that will create a better life for all, should we fail ; we shall be selling the revolution that Sisulus, Thambo's, Peter Mokaba, Chris Hani, Steve Biko, Govan Mbeki and many other martyrs who devoted their lives to the struggle to ensure emancipation of the oppressed from the chains of Apartheid and colonialism.

OUR PROGRAMME FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS (2011-2016)

- 1. Build local economies to create more employment decent work and sustainable livelihoods.
 - Resuscitation of the following projects: Champaign Citrus Farm and chicken Abattoir, Lisbon Citrus Estate, Bushbuckridge clay bricks, Bushbuckridge Nature Reserve, Allandale Citrus Farm, Irrigation Schemes (New Forest, Dingledale and Hoxani) Cork – Thulani Tourism Development and the five LED projects (Aqua-culture, Essential oils, Stone crushing, manufacturing incubator and rural accommodation). It is envisaged that 10 thousand jobs will be created.
- 2. Improve local public services and broaden access
 - Establishment of land fill sites and solid waste recycling
 - Four public libraries, four public parks, two additional DLTCs, naming of streets and public building, acquire electricity distribution licence from Eskom, acquire housing accreditation, fully functioning of the disability centre.

- Tarring of access roads
- Completion of the bulk pipe line from Acornhoek to Manyeleti and Dwarsloop to Acornhoek
- Upgrading of sewer treatment plants.
- VIP toilets.
- Servicing of sites.
- Housing.
- Electrification of outstanding areas and extensions.
- 3. Building more united, integrated and safer communities
 - Implement Spatial Development Framework.
 - Fully functioning of the disaster management centre.
 - Erect high mast lights in outstanding areas.
 - Strengthening of community structures such as CPFs, MAM, and Local Safety Forum etc.
 - Strengthening of programmes and structures designed to empower the target groups.
- 4. Promote more active participation in local government
 - We will ensure that ward committees are established and functional in all the wards.
 - Provide administrative support to ward committees.
 - Ensure that ward committees have report back meetings 14 days after every Council sitting.
 - Implement capacity building programmes for both public representatives and ward committee members.
 - At least eight mayoral imbizos per annum.
 - Communication department will ensure that citizens are at all times informed about municipal activities.
- 5. Ensure more effective, accountable and clean local government that works together with provincial and national government.
 - Strengthening of the following committees: MPAC, oversight committee, audit committee and performance management committee.
 - To strive for a clean audit by 2014.
 - Monitor the implementation of the fraud and prevention strategy.
 - Monitor the implementation of the service standards as per Batho Pele principles.
 - Improve the turn-around time for public queries.
 - Strive for transparency in the supply chain processes.

Countrymen, I have spent time detailing what we want to achieve within 100 days of our office and what we want to achieve in the next five years and I guess the question in every person's mind is what exactly does the ANC led Bushbuckridge municipality Council want to achieve as government.

As enshrined in the 2011 ANC Councillor Resource Pack. What we want to achieve in government is the ANC government that works for achievement of a united, non racial, non sexist, democratic and

prosperous South Africa and for this to happen, as we apply ourselves to these and other tasks, we must acknowledge that we find ourselves in difficult economic times. Jobs are being lost in every economy across the world. We will not be spared the negative impact, and are beginning to feel the pinch. However, the foundations of our economy are strong and we will need to continue to build on them.

This, fellow South Africans the ANC led government feels this will require more hard work than ever before. To achieve all our goals, we must hold ourselves to the highest standards of service, probity and integrity. Together we must build a society that prizes excellence and rewards effort, which shuns laziness and incompetence. We must build a society that draws on the capabilities, energy and promise of its entire people.

The Medium Term Strategic Framework (MTSF) as adopted by the cabinet spells out how government will implement the mandate we have been given by the people. It summarises the electoral mandate as follows:

- Halve poverty and unemployment by 2014
- Ensure a more equitable distribution of the benefits of economic growth and reduce inequality.
- Improve the nation's health profile and skills base and ensure universal access to basic services.
- Improve the safety of citizens by reducing incidents of crime and corruption.
- Build a nation free of all forms of racism, sexism, tribalism and xenophobia.

Fellow South Africans, allow me also to acknowledge the key challenges facing South Africa and government services, we are faced with challenges regarding poverty, inequality and unemployment. In terms of wealth, our society is still divided along racial lines and while a small minority of formally disadvantaged people have managed to become economically empowered, the majority are still in poverty.

Around half of South Africa's people survive on less than R526 per month (the 2008 Statistics South Africa estimate for the amount individual needs to buy basic foods and services). More than half of those who are poor live in female headed households. Around 15 million people receive a social grant of some kind from government of these 12 million are child support.

Unemployment ranges between 24 % and 38 % depending on which measures are used. The official government figures for those who are unemployed but actively seeking work were around 25 % in 2010. More women than men are unemployed and unemployment differences between race groups in 2007 for example; it was 27.7 % for Africans, Coloureds 19.5 %, and Indians 12.7% while it was only 4.6% for whites. People with disabilities are among the poorest and most marginalised in South Africa. About 4% of people are disabled. They are much underrepresented in the available employment statistics and about 1.5 million of the estimated people with disabilities survive on social grants.

To fight against the marginalisation of people living with disability, under the Community Services Directorate a World Class Disability Centre in Marite is currently under construction. The centre will cost the Municipality approximately R9 Million and we believe that by end of this year the building will be completed as it is now 70 % complete. We continue to give wheelchairs and to arrange or organise disability summits and workshops to take stock of the challenges faced by our people living with disability.

These are some of the key challenges we are also facing in Bushbuckridge. As a nodal municipality, it is therefore evident that as enshrined in the Municipal Integrated Development Plan (IDP), we are experiencing difficulties with unemployment, illiteracy, HIV/Aids etc. it is my sincere believe and hope that in these five years, our turnaround strategy will indeed turn around our people lives for their betterment. This Council will make sure that by end of this term of Councillors, there is indeed tangible evidence that our people are now living a better life.

I therefore wish to make a clarion call to the business sector to work hand in hand with us because together we now have to do more, and we have to do it better.
